Field Day 2011 – This will be held June 24-26. Location: TBD. Michael Derbort, KCØELG asking for volunteers to chair the Field Day committee.

Library display at Briargate public library – we have the display for the month of June 2011.

Club station – Doug (N7LEM), Michael (KCØELG), and Dan (WØRO) visited the potential site. Doug talked about the location - 40 acres out 4 miles past Shriever AFA. Possibly have use of part of the barn, flat land. Owner will be putting down foundation soon. Doug suggested that we trade helping build walls and other manpower activities, to help the property owner. This site could be a location for field day.

Ham breakfasts – last one was held at Black Bear Diner. We had 2 new members join us. The next one will be February 5th at A Second Cup, 13860 Gleneagle Dr. Check the website for more details and future locations.

Tech Ed – next VE session the club is sponsoring

is February 12th at 10:00 am at Colorado Tech University. More details are on the website. We need a representative to be the liaison with the club and ARRL and VE examiners. Mike Anderson, WV7T has one student ready for his test and a few others are getting close. 2 technicians and 6 generals.

Doc's 10 meter net 7:00 pm 28.390 #118 tomorrow, The net has had good participation over the last 2 years and continues to be a strong addition to the club.

Forums - Stephen Dalfollo-Daly get them going better. He is reducing the number for Forums which should help the forums become more active. We get a lot of people joining the forums and we need more people to look at them and make comments.

Program – Home brew

Doug, W0MHP. presented two items:

- A cable, coax, and ground entry system for RVing. This was an add-on, lockable panel to the utility section of the RV. It provided a common ground “Window”, wiring areas for line, battery, and/or generator power. When installed on the RV it was constructed to guarantee that it would not be flapping around.
- A common mode choke pig-tail he uses for his RVing. He explained the concept of the common choke and how and why it helps with tuning antennas, as well as explaining how it lowers the noise floor.

Dan, WØRO presented 3 items:

- A 2 meter beam Dan and Pam, WØPRS, constructed for transmitter hunting and that this tape measure antenna worked surprisingly well for transmission too. Of course as he was talking about it and putting the pieces together he put the Reflector in front of the director and that got some chuckles. He also answered questions about the matching system used to get it the 200 ohms beam to match the 50 ohms coax.
- The construction of the Moxon used at Field Day this last year. Doug, N7LEM relayed his experience using it on the GOTA station. Excellent directionality and a good front-to-back ratio.

- Dan then talked about converting the Moxon to a Hex Beam. K5BOB who is the Hex Beam guy that came to the Megafest last year and will be coming again this year, modified the hex beam hub he sells to match the fiberglass parts Dan already has. With the hub, the Moxon was easily converted to a 5 band hex beam. Unlike the Moxon, Dan and Pam found the hex to be very light weight and portable. Dan and Pam were able to push this up using fiberglass camouflage poles with very little issue and used it during COQP.

2. Your SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (now required and includes children). Your SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER or FRN (FCC Registration

Number) if already licensed or previously obtained (required for ALL candidates, regardless of age).

3. Your ORIGINAL amateur radio license (if any) AND a PHOTOCOPY for the VE Team to keep.
4. The ORIGINAL of any relevant CSCEs you may have AND a PHOTOCOPY for the VE Team to keep.
5. Cash, Check or Money Order for \$14 (standard ARRL VE Fee).
