Welcome to the 2011 Southern Colorado Tour de Cure!

We are currently planning the INAUGURAL Southern Colorado Tour de Cure and it's promising to be a fantastic event! We have secured routes, safety & medical support and have an extraordinary post-ride party at the finish line! This guide contains information to help you prepare for the Tour de Cure and tips to ensure you have a great experience on the day of the ride. It's fun and most importantly it's for a great cause - raising funds in support of the 24 million Americans living with diabetes and their families.

Route Descriptions

The Southern Colorado Tour de Cure begins at Meadow Wood Sports Complex located at 2000 Evergreen Heights, Woodland Park. There are four routes designed to appeal to all skill levels. Routes include:

14-Mile Fun Ride: Our family-friendly Fun Ride is accessible to all ages and fitness levels and features beautiful views on a smooth bike path that follows Highway 67.

50-Mile Ride: Our 50 Mile Ride offers a moderate challenge while being safe and scenic. Frequent rest stops and plenty of SAG (Support and Gear) patrols make this ride a great choice for the beginner to intermediate cyclist.

86-Mile Ride: Our 86 Mile Ride features 6,100 feet of climbing and some of the most beautiful scenery in Southern Colorado as it follows the South Platte and then climbs back into Woodland Park with a panoramic view of Pikes Peak , making it the perfect choice for the intermediate to advanced cyclist. Full route support, including rest stops, medical stations, mechanics and SAG vehicles ensures a safe ride from start to finish.

Mountain Bike Route: Our Mountain Bike Course will be challenging enough for your intermediate cyclist but still fun for our beginner riders. Nestled in the Pike National Forest surrounding Woodland Park, this route proves to be one of the best in Colorado!

All of the rides start and end at the Meadow Wood Sports Complex in woodland Park, and proceed north up CO Hwy 67 to Deckers, then loops around through Foxton and Buffalo Creek, and back to Deckers, then down to Woodland Park. The shorter rides don't go as far.

For amateur radio support:

We will need volunteer operators for rest stops, start/stop area, shadows for key personnel, and likely operators with some of the tour vehicles. Also, the tour will be using motorcycle riders (Gold Wing Riders) who will be communicating to each other on CB. Those of you with CB capability can make use of the 11-meter band to keep in touch with those riders when they're in range of your location.

The communications and mission plan is in the works, so that will be ready some time in the near future.

If you've wanting to participate in a public service event, this looks to be a fun and interesting one. So I hope you can! To sign up, visit <http://www.wavelinedata.com/ARESPSE> and look for the section on the Tour de

Cure. (Al Glock KC0PRM will be updating this web site shortly, if it's not already there.)

This ride will be a topic of discussion at the March PPRAA meeting on 3/9, and also at the MARC March meeting on 3/16. Tune in to the nets for additional information.

Plans and support information will be posted to the ppares.org web site as well.

There will likely be hams from PPRAA, MARC and PPARES, and possibly people from other groups such as Park Co. Radio Club, ARES D-23 (Jefferson Co) and ARES D-24 (Douglas Co), depending on our needs and how our coordination goes.

CCARC

The Colorado Council of Amateur Radio Clubs (CCARC) is an umbrella organization for the Amateur Radio Clubs of the State of Colorado. The CCARC has approximately 40 member clubs including PPRAA. The CCARC is a sounding board organization providing all member clubs with a place to develop new ties to organizations that can provide you assistance technically and from a membership standpoint. The CCARC is also the recognized coordination body for repeater and auxiliary linking channels in the state.

If you would like to visit the spring meeting, it is being held on Saturday, April 30, 2011 from 1:00PM to 4:00PM. It will be held at Colorado College, Worner Center in the WES Room (downstairs), 14 East Cache La Poudre Street, Colorado Springs, CO. Parking is just east of Cascade on Cache La Poudre. This meeting is being sponsored by the Cheyenne Mountain Repeater Group.

If you are like me, you generally are not worried about the coordination of the repeaters, you just care that the repeater you want to use is on the air at the frequency as published in a repeater directory or the CCARC repeater map. But coordination goes beyond just repeaters and the each state has a regulatory equivalent to the CCARC which fine tunes the band plans for that

state. For example the Colorado FM Voice Simplex Frequencies for 2 meters have been broken into 26 Channels with 15 KHz channel spacing (or 15K0F3E)

The 26 channel 2-meter simplex frequencies are:

3. Your ORIGINAL amateur radio license (if any) AND a PHOTOCOPY for the VE Team to keep.
4. The ORIGINAL of any relevant CSCEs you may have AND a PHOTOCOPY for the VE Team to keep.
5. Cash, Check or Money Order for \$14 (standard ARRL VE Fee).
