

PPRAA VE session will be held at 9 am on Saturday, June 9th, 2011, at Colorado Technical University.

Directions to CTU are at the PPRAA website ppraa.org.

Applicants will need the following items at the session:

1. A valid PHOTO ID, driver's license preferred (if you do not have a valid photo ID, please call for alternative identification requirements).
2. Your SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (now required and includes children). Your SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER or FRN (FCC Registration Number) if already licensed or previously obtained (required for ALL candidates, regardless of age).
3. Your ORIGINAL amateur radio license (if any) AND a PHOTOCOPY for the VE Team to keep.
4. The ORIGINAL of any relevant CSCEs you may have AND a PHOTOCOPY for the VE Team to keep.
5. Cash, Check or Money Order for \$14 (standard ARRL VE Fee).

Multi-Use Radio System (MURS)

The MURS was officially adopted by the FCC on November 15, 2000 and uses narrowband FM with a maximum effective radiated power of 2 watts. MURS is intended for hand-held, short-range local mobile communications and does not require a license.

MURS 1 = 151.820 MHz
MURS 2 = 151.880 MHz
MURS 3 = 151.940 MHz
MURS 4 = 154.570 MHz
MURS 5 = 154.600 MHz

Requirements:


A copy of the person's amateur radio license and form DR 2810.
